

“Who do men say that I am?”

Yahshua Messiah asked this important question.

“Who do men say that I am?”

The question was important then; it is important now.

Trinitarians, who do you say Yahshua Messiah is?

Do you believe Yahshua Messiah is the Almighty Father manifested in flesh, or do you believe He is the ‘second person’ in the Trinity Doctrine?

According to Yahshua Messiah, what a person believes about who He is, is of eternal importance.

“I AM”

In the Old Testament the Almighty Father proclaims He is **“I AM”** (Exodus 3:14). In the New Testament, Yahshua Messiah proclaims He is **“I AM”**.

In the Gospel of John, John writes of eight instances where Yahshua Messiah refers to Himself as **“I AM”**. In the book of Revelation, John writes of seven instances where Yahshua Messiah refers to Himself as **“I AM”**.

In calling Himself **“I AM”**, Yahshua Messiah is identifying Himself as the Almighty Father of the Old Testament.

The Apostle Paul writes,

“God was manifested in the flesh”
1 Timothy 3:16

Paul did not write,

God’s son was manifested in the flesh

Yahshua Messiah makes an explicit declaration in John 8:24

“Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins;
for if you do not believe that I am *He*, you will die in your sins.”

Notice the (*He*) in this verse is in italics, which means that it was not in the original Greek, but was added by the translators.

Furthermore, the Greek words translated as “I am” are ‘EGO EIMI’ which is: “**I AM**”.

John 8:24 is actually as follows,

“Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins;
for if you do not believe that **I AM**, you will die in your sins.”

Yahshua Messiah declares in John 8:24 that a person who wants cleansing from sin must believe that He is “**I AM**”; the Almighty Father manifested in flesh who came to be the sacrifice for our sins.

Thirty four verses later in John 8:58, Yahshua Messiah again declares He is “**I AM**”; assuring those who will listen that He is the Almighty Father of the Old Testament manifested in flesh.

“Most assuredly, I say to you,
before Abraham was, **I AM**.”

Therefore to say that Yahshua Messiah is not the Almighty Father is completely unbiblical and of grave consequences.
