

This 'Doctrine' created a major **problem** for Trinitarians regarding The Almighty's name, for if The Almighty is comprised of **'three distinct persons'** (as *Trinitarian paintings* portray), what then **is** The Almighty's **SINGULAR NAME?**

Understandably, people were perplexed asking, **"What is His singular name if He is comprised of three distinct persons?"** For example, **if all 'three distinct persons'** were gathered together, **what then, is The Almighty's singular name?**



The answer to their dilemma was found by using the generic term **'God'** for their **'three person deity'**. By using the term **'God'**, **His true name was no longer a problem, nor was it needed.** Problem solved; thereby popularizing the term **'God'** with Believer's, whilst leaving The Almighty's **true name** just **a forgotten memory.**

Regrettably, Pastors, teachers, authors and Believers have **replaced** The Almighty's **true name** with the common and generic term **'God.'** If truth be told, The Almighty's **true name** has been put aside and **forgotten** by most Believer's.

Sadly, when Believer's use the **generic term 'God'**, they are completely **eliminating The Fathers name**, as well as **robbing Him** of the **glory due Him** as being **our Savior.** Furthermore, Believer's **are using the same generic term, 'God'** that is used by **false religions** around the world when they worship **their false god's and deities.**

Believer's, when we lift up and proclaim **"the name above every name"**, **Yahshua**, we are proclaiming allot! Not only in the eyes of our Savior, **but to all the world around us!** For we are **specifically** and **scripturally** lifting up the **One True Almighty.**

The **invisible Father** in the Old Testament, became our **visible Savior** in the New Testament

The Bible tells us The Almighty Father manifested **Himself** in flesh as a man, to do for us what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. He fulfilled the demands of the Law **as a perfect man of flesh**, so that He could be our perfect sacrifice, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior.

On the cross He took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon Himself, paying our price, and thereby making us **holy, blameless, and without a single fault in His eyes.**

This is the gospel. **This is the Good News.**

Salvation is a **gift** we receive when we call upon Yahshua Messiah, The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

The **gift** of salvation cannot be earned by our deeds, works, or fruitless self-righteous attempts at keeping the law.

We cannot obtain it by being 'a good person' or by attending church.

Ephesians 2:8 tells us,

*"God saved you by **His grace** when you believed, and you can't take credit for this,*

it is a gift from God.

Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it."

We can only receive our salvation as a **gift** from Yahshua Messiah... **'to us'.**

Everyone who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him **now** for tomorrow is not assured.

Believer's, Try to call Him by **His Name** and not the term **'God'**

I was recently in the 'Christian section' of a bookstore. Without exception, **ALL** of the authors of these Christian books used the term **'God'** in their book titles and not **The Almighty's actual name.**

Question:

Why do Christian Pastors, authors and Believer's all use the term **'God'** and not use **The Almighty's actual name?**

Believer's, **do you know why?**

I do, and I would like **you** to know too.

I think it is **very important** that **you know why** the term **'God'** is used **and not His name.**

There are two main reasons

The first reason is because The Almighty Father's name was **removed** from the Bible 6,828 times and replaced with the word **'God'**. The word **'God'** is a **'term'**, it is **not** a name.

The **elimination** of The Almighty Father's name and replacing it with the unscriptural and generic term **'God'**, is so **strange** and **demonic** that it brings to mind the words of the Apostle Paul,

“For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places.”

Ephesians 6:12

“To remove the name is to extinguish the person”

“In the Scriptures there is the closest possible relationship between a person and his name, the two being practically equivalent, so that to remove the name is to extinguish the person.”

The second reason is because of the ‘Trinity Doctrine’. The ‘Trinity Doctrine’ was concocted by the Catholic church at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD; **hundreds of years after** the inspired writers of the New Testament lived.

Contradicting the words of The Almighty **Himself**, The Catholic church proclaimed that The Almighty was **not a singular One** as stated **numerous** times in the Bible, but was instead **‘one being’** comprised of **‘THREE distinct persons’ EACH fully God’**.

‘God’, ‘LORD’, ‘Lord’

Believer, you may be very surprised to learn that the words **‘God’, ‘LORD’, and ‘Lord’, are NOT Scriptural words at all.**

The King James translators **erred** in translating the Old Testament Hebrew word **‘Yahweh’**. The translators **incorrectly** used the **unscriptural** and **pagan** word **‘God’** in place of the name **‘Yahweh.’**

The meaning of the word ‘God’

Believer’s, look at the **meaning** of the word **‘God’** according to these three highly regarded sources,

‘GOD’ is the common Teutonic word for a personal object of religious worship, applied to all the superhuman beings of the heathen mythologies, and various kinds of idols.

The King James translators made another translation error regarding **the name of the Almighty**. They **changed** the name **‘Yahweh’**, to the Anglo-Saxon word, **‘LORD’**.

According to **‘New Unger’s Bible Dictionary’**, the word **‘LORD’** that we see in the Old Testament, **should have been translated as Yahweh**.

Unger’s states regarding this translation error:

“Yahweh, is used as a proper name of the Almighty and should have been retained in that form by the translators.”

What is The Almighty Fathers Name?

King David tells us plainly in Psalm 68:4 that The Almighty Fathers name is **YAH**.

David writes:

*“Sing to God, sing praises to His name;
Extol Him who rides on the clouds,
By His name YAH, and rejoice before Him.”*

The Almighty Fathers name is **YAH** in the Old Testament, but does The Almighty Father as Savior, still have the name **YAH** in the **New Testament?**

YES! In the Old Testament, when you see the word **‘LORD’** (*which is not a name*), it is **actually** The Almighty Fathers **name Yahweh**.

YAH-weh is a **compound name**, meaning The Almighty Fathers name **YAH**, is combined with a ‘descriptor’. The descriptor is the word **‘weh’**, which means, ‘The Self-Existent one’ (**I AM**). The name **YAH-weh** means: **‘YAH - The Self-Existent one’**.

YAH, waited to give us His **highest** name until **He came to us Himself** in the New Testament! **YAH**, now combines His name with **His highest ‘descriptor’**. This descriptor is the Hebrew word **‘shua’**, which means **‘is salvation.’** When you combine The Almighty Fathers name **YAH**, with His highest descriptor **‘shua’**, (**YAHshua**) it means, **“YAH is salvation”!**

The Almighty Father is proclaiming **His highest name to us as our Savior!**

This is why **‘Yahshua’** **“is the name which is above every name”!** (Philippians 2:9)

How the Trinity Doctrine eliminated The Almighty’s name

Contradicting Scripture, the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ teaches that The Almighty is **not ONE person**, but that He is **‘one being’** comprised of **‘three distinct persons**.

When the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ came... **confusion came to Believer’s**. Believer’s were **confused** about **which person** they should **worship** and **pray to**, and **what was His singular name if He was comprised of ‘three distinct persons’?**
