

YAH YAHweh YAHshua
Are names of The Almighty Father

YAH is The Almighty Father's name.
(Psalm 68:4; Isaiah 12:2; Revelation 19:1-6 (Hallelu**YAH**))

YAHweh is The Almighty Father's name with a 'descriptor' added. The descriptor 'weh' means, 'The Self-Existent one' (**I AM**). **YAH**-weh means, 'YAH - The Self-Existent one'.

YAHshua In the New Testament, **YAH** now combines His name with His **highest** descriptor 'shua', which means 'is salvation.' **YAH**-shua means, 'YAH is Salvation'. This is the name above **every** name!

"You, shall call His name Yahshua"

1. The Almighty Father had a **purpose** for sending an angel and giving these instructions to Yosef. The Almighty Father wanted His Old Testament name **YAH**, to **remain His name** in the **New Testament** covenant of grace!
2. The names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' **completely eliminate** The Almighty Fathers name.
3. Because the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' **eliminate** the Fathers name, **these names have eliminated His identity** as being **our Savior**.
4. Using the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua', people can no longer **easily identify** that **YAH, The Almighty Father** is in fact our Savior... **for the identity of our Savior is found in His name!**
5. Because the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' have **removed** The Almighty Fathers name, **He** has been **robbed** of the **glory** that belongs to **Him** as being **our only Savior**. Believer, these are **great wrongs** that need to be **made right** by this generation of Believers.

The **invisible Father** in the Old Testament, became our **visible Savior** in the New Testament

The Bible tells us The Almighty Father manifested **Himself** in flesh as a man, to do for us what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. He fulfilled the demands of the Law **as a perfect man of flesh**, so that He could be our perfect sacrifice, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior.

On the cross He took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon Himself, paying our price, and thereby making us **holy, blameless, and without a single fault in His eyes**.

This is the gospel. **This is the Good News**.

Salvation is a **gift** we receive when we call upon Yahshua Messiah, The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

The **gift** of salvation cannot be earned by our deeds, works, or fruitless self-righteous attempts at keeping the law.

We cannot obtain it by being a good person or by attending church.

Ephesians 2:8 tells us,

*"God saved you by **His grace** when you believed, and you can't take credit for this, **it is a gift from God**.*

Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it."

We can only receive our salvation as a **gift** from Yahshua Messiah... **"to us"**.

Everyone who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him **now**, tomorrow is not assured.

YAHweh is The Father's name in the **Old Testament** **YAHshua** is The Father's name in the **New Testament**

Most Believers know **The Almighty Father** is the **preeminent** figure in the **Old Testament**.

However, many believers do not **realize** that **The Almighty Father** is the **preeminent** figure in the **New Testament as well**. (*Think of Philip not knowing who Yahshua **actually was** in John 14:8-9*).

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** is an **invisible spirit**. In the New Testament, the Apostle Paul tells us **The Almighty Father** came to us a **man manifested in flesh**.

There is only one 'I AM'

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** proclaims that **He** is '**I AM**' (Exodus 3:14).

In the New Testament, **Yahshua Messiah** proclaims that **He** is '**I AM**' (John 8:58).

Are there **two** 'I AM's'?

No. **The Almighty Father** is the **only** 'I AM'.

The Apostle Paul gives us understanding.

Paul tells us in 1 Cor. 8:6, **"for us there is one God, the Father."** In Ephesians 4:6 Paul tells us there is... **"one God and Father of all."**

Paul then tells us our **"one God, the Father"** came to us manifested in the flesh of a man.

"God was manifested in the flesh"

1 Timothy 3:16

1.

There is only one **Great God**

In the **Old** Testament **The Almighty Father** is called the **“great God.”**

In the **New** Testament the Apostle Paul calls **Yahshua Messiah** our **“great God.”**

Are there **two great God’s**? **No. The Almighty Father** is the **only ‘great God’**.

In Titus 2:13, the Apostle Paul **clearly identifies by name** who our **“great God”** and **Savior** is.

*“looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of **our great God** and **Savior** Jesus Christ” (Yahshua Messiah)*

Before The Almighty Father came to earth to become our Savior, **specific instructions** were given to Joseph by an angel **regarding His name.**

“you shall call His name Yahshua.”

Scripture tells us **YAH** chose this name for Himself. **He did not allow men to choose or decide His name** (Matthew 1:21; Luke 2:21). His instructions were clear... **“you shall call His name Yahshua”**.

We must keep in mind that the angel who spoke to Joseph did not speak to Joseph in English, Latin or Greek, but spoke to him in his own language...

Hebrew. The Father wanted to make sure that His Old Testament name **‘YAH’**, would **follow Him** into the New Testament Covenant! The Almighty Father wanted His name in the Old Testament to **remain His name** in the New Testament... **YAH!**

When the the **‘invisible’ Father** of the Old Testament came to us as a man manifested in flesh, He had already **made sure** through Joseph, that His name in the Old Testament, **would remain** His name in the New Testament. His name would **remain YAH, with His highest descriptor added!** **YAH-shua means, YAH is salvation!**

2.

Men give The Almighty Father a **new ‘Hellenized’ name... ‘Jesus’**

Against the Father’s specific instructions, men did end up choosing the Savior’s name after all.

After many **needless** transliterations of the **Hebrew** name **‘Yahshua’**, our Savior was given a **new ‘Hellenized’ name... ‘Jesus’**.

This new ‘Hellenized’ name removed all traces of **‘Jewishness’** from the Saviors original Hebrew name. (*Yosef and Miryam got new ‘Hellenized’ names too; they were now ‘Joseph’ and ‘Mary’*).

Shamefully, the new name **‘Jesus’**, **completely removed** The Almighty Father’s name, **YAH!**

“To remove the name is to extinguish the person”

*“In the Scriptures there is the closest possible relationship between a person and his name, the two being practically equivalent, so that to remove the name is to extinguish the person. To forget God’s name **is to depart from Him.**”*

Why ‘Yeshua’ is **not the Saviors name**

Our Savior **Himself** tells us **His name** is **Yahshua**, not **‘Yeshua’** in John 17:11.

*...keep them in **Your name**, the name which **You have given Me...***

There are **many scriptures** in the Bible proclaiming The Almighty Father’s name is **YAH**, but **there are NO scriptures** proclaiming His name is **‘Ye’**.

In Revelation 19:1-6, the multitudes are shouting Hallelu-**YAH**, they are **NOT** shouting Hallelu-**Ye**.

The name **‘Yeshua’**, like the name **‘Jesus’**, **completely removes** and **eliminates** The Almighty Fathers **glorious** and **sacred name.**

Both the names **‘Jesus’** and **‘Yeshua’**, **rob** The Almighty Father of **His name, His identity** and the **glory** that is **due Him** as being **our Savior.**

“for us there is **one God, the Father”**

The Apostle Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 8:6,

“for us there is **one God, the Father.”**

Because we know that **Yahshua is God**, we **know** because of 1 Cor. 8:6, that **Yahshua** is **The Almighty Father** come manifested in flesh.

Additionally, Yahshua **Himself** proclaims that **He** is **“I AM”** (John 8:58). It is **inarguable** that **‘I AM’** is The Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14.

When you lift up the name **YAHshua**, you are proclaiming what that name **means**; that **YAH, The Almighty Father** came to us manifested in flesh and is **our Savior.**

Moreover, we must **always remember** that **‘Yahshua’** is the name **The Father chose for Himself!** (Matthew 1:21)

The name **YAHshua**, which means **‘YAH is salvation’**, is **“the name above all names”** because it **glorifies the Father as our Savior!**
